HOUSING EXECUTIVE SOCIAL ENTERPRISE PLUS STRATEGY.

The Housing Executive are the Strategic Housing Authority for Northern Ireland and a landlord at scale. It is a non-departmental public body, established by the Housing Executive Act (NI) 1971 (since superseded by the Housing (Northern Ireland) Order 1981).

The Housing Executive's four-year Social Enterprise Plus Strategy focused on continuing to expand its work relating to supporting social enterprises, with an emphasis on developing individuals, strengthening communities and maximizing partnership working. The Housing Executive's approach has provided an avenue to improve life chances via the creation of community owned social enterprises and training opportunities within and for the benefit of housing communities.

SOCIAL IMPACT (SROI)

We have used the Social Value Engine, an online tool accredited by Social Value International, which enabled the Housing Executive Social Enterprise team with independent support from Rose Regeneration, to identify a monetary value to represent the social impact created by their work.

This analysis is of the funding and support that the strategy has delivered and the subsequent outcomes between 2020-24.
